Technology Strategic Planning Set to Begin

Texas Wesleyan University has formed a Technology Strategic Planning Committee charged with developing a “comprehensive and inclusive three-year technology strategic plan describing how Texas Wesleyan University will use technology to further its mission.”

The University Technology Strategic Plan will be used for the following purposes: to

provide the university with a clear vision and goals, to create positive change, to market the university to potential students and employees, assist in acquiring funding, and achieve improved results faster.

The planning committee is composed of members from each major stakeholder group (senior administration, students, faculty, staff, alumni, and academic and

administrative support personnel). Input from members of the University community is welcomed. If you have questions, concerns, or wish to provide information, please contact your committee representative.

Deadline for Planning Survey Submission Nears

As part of the Technology Strategic Planning Cycle, the committee has commissioned a number of data gathering efforts. These include a software and hardware inventory, a student survey, a faculty survey, a staff survey, an administrator survey, a survey for the CIO, and the gathering of benchmark data.

The results of these efforts will be used to help the committee in focusing its efforts for the current planning endeavor.
